<b>because</b>	Explains why something is true	
Conjunction	What it does	
<b>but</b>	Indicates a change, similar to a U-turn

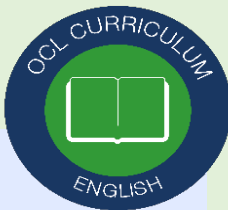

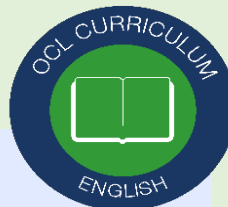
